### **Nosotros Commands**

So, what's a "nosotros command" anyway? Aren't commands usually directed toward *you* (tú/vosotro, usted/ustedes) instead of we? Well, yes.

We call the following commands, but they're really another way of saying *let's* or *may we* [do something]. For example:

Let's work together. Trabajemos juntos. Let's eat here. Comamos aquí.

May we all live in peace. *Vivamos todos en paz.* May you always be happy. *Siempre estés feliz.* 

#### **Affirmative Nosotros Commands**

There are two ways to form nosotros commands: 1. using subjunctive (opposite) endings as above, and 2. using the ir+a+infinitive formula. For example:

Let's go to the restaurant.

Let's go to the beach.

Let's have some fun!

Let's go swim.

Vamos al restaurante.

Vamos a ir a la playa.

¡Vamos a divertirnos!

Vamos a nadar.

Notice that all of the commands above are affirmative; that is, they all tell or invite the listener to do something. But what if you want to tell or invite the listener *not* to do something?

## **Negative Nosotros Commands**

To form a negative nosotros command, you simply put "no" or another negative word before the affirmative command. For example:

Let's not swim. No nademos. Let's not leave. No salgamos.

Let's never go there. Nunca vayamos allí.
Let's not be here, either. Tampoco estemos aquí.

# Affirmative Commands with Indirect Object Pronouns

When attaching an indirect object pronoun to the end of a nosotros command, follow these steps:

- 1. drop the final -s from the verb
- 2. attach the indirect object pronoun
- 3. add an accent to the verb's next-to last-syllable

Sentemos + nos = Sentémonos Let's sit down.
Hagamos + se + la = Hagámoselo Let's make it for her.
Vamos + nos = Vámonos Let's go.
Despertemos + nos = Despertémonos Let's wake up.
Lavemos + nos = Lavámonos Let's wash up.

When using the *ir+a+infinitive* formula:

Let's sit here. Vamos a sentarnos aquí. Let's go to sleep. Vamos a dormirnos.

### **Negative Commands with Indirect Object Pronouns**

Put the indirect object pronoun and/or direct object between the negative word and the verb.

Let's not eat it.

No lo comamos.

Let's not give it to them.

No se lo demos.

### **Irregular Verbs**

-are all still irregular.
