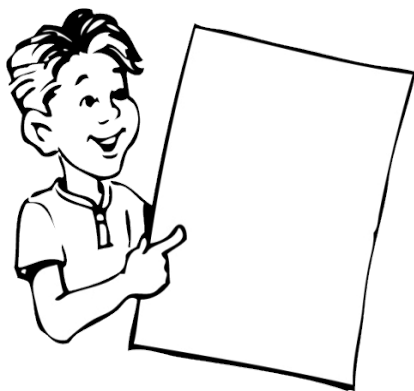




ENSEÑA & EXPLICA

1. 4. Hand this paper to your teacher before you present.

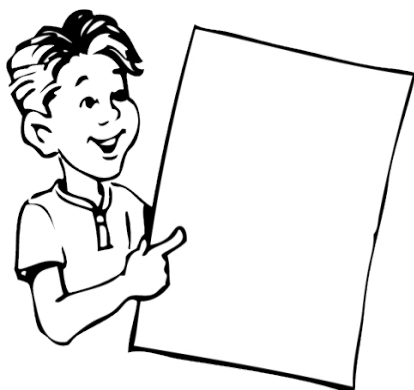
Don't worry about making mistakes—this is bound to happen, especially when you are trying to avoid it. So, don't overthink the assignment. Have fun with it and your audience will, too!
